

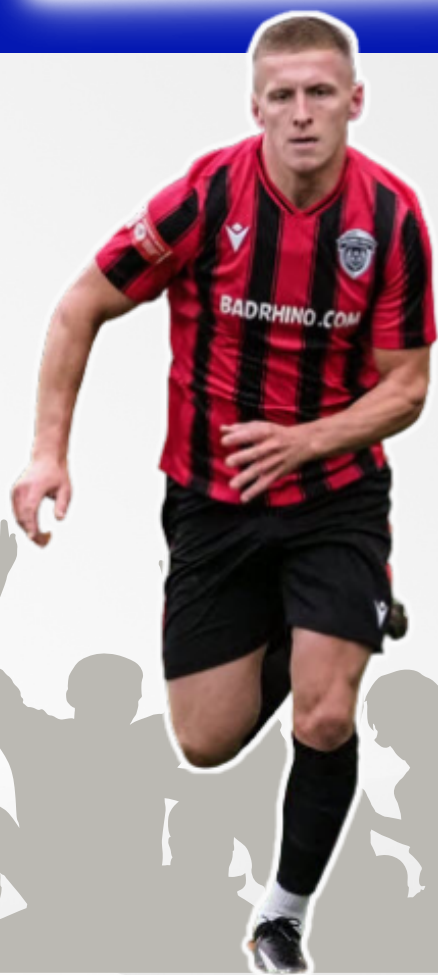

History of Lye Town FC

The club were established in 1930 as Lye & Wollescote Amateur Football Club and joined the Worcestershire Combination. They were renamed Lye Town the following year. The club were runners-up in the Worcestershire Combination in 1932–33 and won the Birmingham Junior Cup the following season. Lye were league runners-up again in 1934–35 before winning the league in 1935–36. Lye were runners-up in the Worcestershire Combination for a third time in 1937–38, also winning the Birmingham Junior Cup, retaining the Cup the following season.

Following World War II Lye played in the Central Amateur League in the 1946–47 season before joining the Birmingham & District League in 1947. Lye were placed in the South Division when the league was re-organised in 1954, with a tenth-place finish seeing us placed in Division One for the 1955–56 season. We subsequently finished bottom of the Division and were relegated to Division Two. The league reverted to a single division in 1960 and was renamed the West Midlands (Regional) League in 1962.

The league gained a second division in 1965, with Lye becoming members of the Premier Division. Despite finishing bottom of the Premier Division in 1965–66 and 1966–67, the club were not relegated to Division One. Lye were Premier Division runners-up in 1976–77 before finishing second in three consecutive seasons between 1978–79 and 1980–81. In 1997–98 the club were Premier Division champions, but were not promoted to the Midland Alliance due to ground grading regulations.

2010–11 Lye won the Birmingham Midweek Floodlit Cup, beating Nuneaton Griff 1–0 in the final. Lye were Premier Division runners-up in 2012–13 and won the Floodlit Cup for a second time with a 2–1 win over Southam United in the final. The club went on to win both the Worcestershire Senior Urn and the Premier Division the following season, earning promotion to the Premier Division of the newly formed Midland League. In the 2021–22 season Lye won the JW Hunt Cup.

In 2022-23 Lye finished second to Walsall Wood in the Midland League Premier Division. Having come runners up they were drawn away to Cambridgeshire side St Neots Town in a Step 4/5 Inter Play-Off game. Lye won 6-1 and gained promotion to Step 4 for the first time in their history.

GROUND

The club play at the Sports Ground on Stourbridge Road, which is shared with the local cricket club. a temporary rail is erected on the northern side of the pitch during the football season.



A seated stand was built at the Stourbridge Road end after World War II. A new stand was built on the southern side of the pitch in 1971, with the seats from the post-war stand later moved into the newer stand when the older stand was demolished. The club has a covered standing area with a barrel roof built behind one goal.

Haydn Brown – Recently signed local player who can make explosive runs into the area causing problems for any defence.

George Clark - What can be said about Clarky, still very young and raw but all at the club see nothing but a really bright future. Fantastic and an ever present since coming in from Cheltenham Town, the young full back has gone from strength to strength.

Dylan Hunniford - Young youth team is an exciting prospect who has made a notable impression. We are expecting further development from Dylan and believe he has a bright future at the club.

Jayden Cotterill - Jayden was a young professional with Burton Albion before making a name for himself in non-league with Barwell, Hanley Town and Belper Town. Now in his mid 20's with plenty of experience under his belt, Jayden will be a senior figure and key player in this new look Rovers side. A technical defender who loves to bring the ball out and play and is very quick across the ground we believe Jayden will be the perfect foil for Mason Frizelle this coming season.

Riley Davoile - Delighted to acquire gifted central midfield player Riley for 23/24 season.

At 22 years of age Riley is looking to take a step up in level following two fantastic seasons with Coventry United where he has been club captain.

Riley is a technical midfielder who plays off both feet, and despite playing from a deep lying role is regular contributor of goals and often the spectacular. This is a player we believe can transcend levels and we are excited to work with him and see him develop.

Tyler Donaldson - Young defender Ty was a fixture in the side in the first half of last season having stepped up in levels, and really impressed. His season was hampered by injury which slowed his progress however we believe we have a real raw talent and are over the moon he shall continue his development with us in 23/24.

Jordan Edwards – Recently signed for the club.

Jack Ekin-Tyson – Recently signed from Belper United. The midfielder has also played for South Normanton.

Jon Guy – Jon needs no introduction having previously played 118 games for Rovers. He joins us from Belper United.

Richard Hanslow – Striker Another familiar face back at the Moat having made over 100 appearances for Rovers previously.

Dylan Hunniford - Young youth team graduate Dylan is an exciting prospect who has made a notable impression. We are expecting further development from Dylan and believe he has a bright future at the club.

Chris Jones – Recently signed from Belper United

John King - Wide player who can play on either on the left or right. Has experience with Shepshed Dynamo, Stamford, Quorn, South Normanton and Radford.

Alby Lansdowne - Was manager's player of the year and standout performer last term. The versatile defender/midfielder has become the foundation of this Rovers side and really now fulfilling all of his promise shown in his early years at the football club. Again, it is so important that we have local representation by players we have developed and nurtured ourselves, and Alby we feel is well on the way to becoming a club icon in the mould of Jamie Barrett and the likes. Great to have Alby staying with Rovers despite inevitable interest from elsewhere!

Kane Lee - who had a good season last time and is still building back from knee surgery. Kane is a product of our youth team and is highly thought of by the club and it is so important to us that our talented, home-grown players continue to represent the club.

Ryan Mason - Recently joined the club. The former Burton Albion u18's left back has also played for Solihull Moors, Highgate, Romulus, Alvechurch and Racing Club Warwick as former clubs.

Kieran O'Connell - Kieran is yet another familiar face. Popular forward made 114 appearances for Rovers scoring 36 goals previously.

Jamie Sleigh - Locally based ace marksman Jamie rose to prominence at Heanor Town where he has scored an incredible 147 goals in 174 appearances. His success at Heanor Town also resulted in a two-year stint with Stafford Rangers, where Jamie again found himself amongst the goals at step 3. Having struggled for goals last season this is an exciting addition and we are so pleased to have this over the line.

Martin Smyth - Back at the Moat for a third time. Always a popular player making 117 appearances and scoring 28 goals.

Harvey Woodward - Young goalkeeper who is on loan from Ilkeston Town

Management

Marc Strzyzewski - Manager - In October 2023 Marc joined the club from Belper United having led them to great success during his time there. He leaves them in second position in the United Counties Premier Division North League, the clubs highest position in its history, having previously gained promotion to the UCL Premier North division via the playoffs in the 2021/22 season. Marc is well known to many at the Moat Ground having been a former player for the club with 89 appearances between 2012 and 2014. He also notably played for several other clubs non-league levels at steps 3, 4 and 5 including Micklover Sports, Leek Town, Belper Town and Heanor Town.

Thom Kellogg - Assistant Manager - Thom started his career as a teenager at Holbrook Sports FC in the reserves before progressing up to the first team where he played for 10 years. After leaving Holbrook Sports FC he moved on to play for and captain Borrowash Victoria AFC before making the step up to Micklover Sports in the Northern Premier League. From there he went on to play for Coalville Town FC before returning to Micklover Sports FC for a 2nd spell. Once the Borrowash Victoria AFC managers job came up he made his first step into management where he was player/manager. He then went on to be coach and assistant manager at South Normanton Athletic FC where he achieved promotion to the Midland Premier League and from there followed Marc Strzyzewski to Belper United FC where they again won promotion via the playoffs to the United Counties Premier Division North and leaves them currently playing at the highest level and position in the club's history. He now makes his next step-in management as part of Marc Strzyzewski team at Gresley Rovers FC.

Lee Mitchell - Coach Following his release from Stoke City, after being unsuccessful in securing a professional contract, Lee spent most of his non-league football career at Step 5 and 6. This was most noticeably with Holbrook Sports, Borrowash Victoria AFC and South Normanton Athletic. It was at the latter where he played Left Back alongside Marc Strzyzewski under a management team which included Thom Kellogg, achieving promotion as a highlight. He finished his playing career at South Normanton in the Midlands Premier League and formed part of Marc's management team at the same club. Lee followed Marc to Belper United, achieving instant success in gaining promotion to the United Counties Premier Division North and now joins Marc and Thom making the move to South Derbyshire.

Calum Miller (Physio) - Callum joined the club after graduating with a degree in Sports Therapy from Staffordshire University in 2020. He worked with the Youth and Reserve teams before stepping up to the first team during the close season.

Club History



Gresley Rovers were formed in 1882 in the small mining village of Church Gresley, which is near to Swadlincote - the biggest town in South Derbyshire. Their first ground was at Mushroom Lane in Albert Village a mile or so from Church Gresley and they played mainly friendlies and cup games for ten years before joining the Burton Junior League for the 1892/93 season. They won their first league title in the 1894/95 season eleven points clear of their nearest rivals in the Burton Junior League.

Rovers moved from the quaintly named Mushroom Lane ground (which they shared with the local cricket club Mushroom Lane CC) to the newly acquired Church Street Ground in time for the 1895/96 season. They stayed at Church Street till near the end of the 1907/08 season when they had to move as the land was required for building and moved across the road onto the newly acquired Moat Ground - the ground they still play on today.

Six seasons from 1985/6 Gresley finish 4th, 4th, 2nd, 3rd, 1st and 1st. During that period, they also won the Derbyshire Senior Cup on four successive occasions. Season 1990/91 was a particularly good one for Gresley. In addition to the League Title and the Derbyshire Senior Cup win they also reached the final of the F.A. Vase and so had the honour of playing at Wembley. Their opponents were Guiseley and some National Newspapers reported it as 'the most exciting Wembley Cup Final ever'. Unfortunately, they only drew before losing the replay.

Paul Futchter was appointed manager with Garry Birtles, former England International, his assistant on 2nd November 1995. The season 1996/7 was the best in the Club's long history because in addition to retaining the Derbyshire Senior Cup they also won the Dr. Martens Premier Division championship. Rovers were unbeaten in their first seventeen league games (won 10 drawn 7) and were league leaders for 31 weeks. The title was finally won with a 3 - 1 home victory against Gloucester City at the Moat Ground on April 26th 1997. Gresley Rovers became the first Derbyshire side and first village side to win this prestigious trophy, but ground grading meant that they were unable to gain promotion to the Football Conference. After financial difficulties, Gresley Rovers liquidated at the end of the 2008-09 season, forming a new football club, Gresley F.C.

Gresley FC

Gresley FC was formed in 2009 and enjoyed a very successful first season in the East Midlands Counties League. The side, managed by Gary Norton, finished as runners up and therefore narrowly missed out on promotion. Gresley also enjoyed a long run in the FA Vase by beating Spennymoor, Dawlish and Long Buckby. The Dawlish tie will live long in the memory as the original tie was abandoned in extra time and the Moatmen won the replay in South Derbyshire on penalties. The Vase run came to an end in front of the home fans in disappointing fashion at home to Whitehawk in the quarterfinals....

Club History

(Continued)

2010-2011 Gresley's second season as a club and also their second in the East Midlands Counties League saw another good FA Vase run getting to the last 32 and then going one step further from the previous season by winning the league after an exciting run-in. Being a few points behind the leading contenders Gresley could not afford to slip up again after an unexpected home defeat in early January if their dreams were to be realised. An amazing 20 game unbeaten run with the final 8 all victories saw Gresley crowned as champions and promoted into the Midland Football Alliance.

Season 2011-2012 saw another good run in the FA Vase reaching the last 16 and to top off a superb season Gresley achieved a remarkable back-to-back title success as they lifted the Midland Football Alliance title at their first attempt and promotion to the Evo-Stik NPL Division One South. The first season back at level four was successful as Gresley settled into the Division One South. Gresley finished just outside the top ten in the league and reached the 3rd Qualifying round of the FA Cup. At the end of the season joint manager Gary Norton stepped down with Martin Rowe named as manager.

His second season, 2017-2018 was not much better but it ended in a disappointing manner when the manager, management team and most of the players left the club with just four games remaining and the danger of being relegated. Former Moat boss Gary Norton stepped in to steer the club to the end of a trying season and using a mixture of reserve and youth team players managed to keep the club in step 4 finishing 17th. Norton agreed to take on the role of manager for season 2018-2019 and along with assistant Carl Slater and player/coach Jamie Barrett have started to rebuild a side that hopefully be more competitive than the last two seasons. Early in January 2019 Norton stood down and Gavin Hurren was appointed as manager. Unfortunately, at the end of the season, Gresley were relegated from the Evo-Stik East to the Midland League. Hurren left early in the new season to be replaced by David McDermott. Gresley's results failed to improve and in February McDermott was relieved of his position. Former manager Gary Norton again stepped in to steer the ship until the end of the season.

Rovers Return

During the summer of 2020, the Gresley FC board met to discuss the possibility of re-naming the club and a unanimous decision saw the Gresley Rovers name return to non-league football. Manager Carl Abbott and assistant manager Paul Thomlinson found the previous season interrupted and finally curtailed due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

During the summer of 2021 the FA re-organised the non-league pyramid and Rovers were placed into the United Counties League. After finishing runners-up Rovers were promoted to the Northern Premier League Midland Division for 2022-2023. The first season at level 4 was tough and Gresley finished just above the relegation positions. The start of season 2023-2024 hasn't got off to the best start and so Carl Abbott was relieved of his duties and Marc Strzyzewski was appointed at the beginning of October bringing with him Thom Kellogg as his assistant and Lee Mitchell as coach.

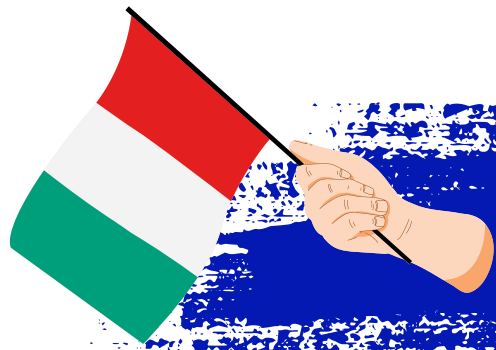

Postcard from Italy!

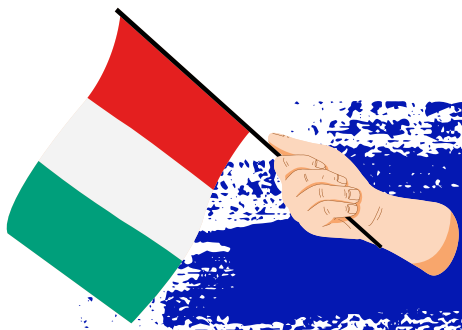
Now that Gianni Infantino and his cronies have stitched up Australia by awarding the 2034 World Cup to another climate destroying petrodollar Gulf State, is it time to think about life outside FIFA?

Progressive Scandinavian nations have shown a willingness to stick two fingers up at FIFA – see Denmark's deliberately sombre kit in Qatar – and if one or two of Europe's football powers could be persuaded to join the revolt (Germany, France, Italy?) we could start contemplating a fresh start for the game, away from the Gulf states and various international pariahs.

After all, other sports have had their crises and splintered world governing bodies, just look at darts and boxing. A breakaway football organisation would also fit with the current trend of moving away from the globalisation dream which has seen so many manufacturing jobs drained from the UK.

When you take all that into consideration, maybe we, as football fans, should thank Mr Infantino for making World Cup participation such an unattractive prospect.

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

- SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with **NO SYMPTOMS** or family history.
- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - **IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.**
- Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.
- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.
