Today we welcome our visitors Spalding United to what I believe is their first ever trip to The Sports Ground.

They have followed up on last season's strong showing when they reached the play offs by sitting top of the league having only lost once in 10 games.

We hope they enjoy their time with us and have safe journeys here and home again

It's been a long 5 weeks since the 1st team played at home.

That was a comfortable 4-2 win against Rugby Town.



We have then had a run of 3 tough away games, a goalless draw away at Corby, followed by a narrow 1-0 defeat at 3rd placed Harborough Town (where we were denied a blatant penalty) and finally an excellent 1-0 win away at 4th placed Bedworth United last weekend.

This has left us sitting in 7th place in the league, a good start for our first time at this level.

After today's match against league leaders Spalding United we have 4 league games in November, including away at 2nd placed Loughborough Dynamo next weekend, at home to Sporting Khalsa on Tuesday 14th November and home to in form Quorn on 25th November.

We have also drawn a very attractive home fixture in the next round of the Birmingham Senior Cup - at home to our high flying neighbours Halesowen Town on Tuesday 21st November. Full details on admission prices and advance ticket sales to be published shortly.

Our Ladies team continue their excellent start to the season.

In the league they remain unbeaten and sit 2nd in the table 1 point behind Worcester City Women with a game in hand.

They have also progressed to the First Round Proper of the Vitality Womens FA Cup where they have been drawn away to West Bromwich Albion Ladies on 12th November. Details to be confirmed shortly.

I hope you all have an enjoyable afternoon and look forward to a good game of football.

History of Lye Town FC

The club were established in 1930 as Lye & Wollescote Amateur Football Club and joined the Worcestershire Combination. They were renamed Lye Town the following year. The club were runners-up in the Worcestershire Combination in 1932–33 and won the Birmingham Junior Cup the following season. Lye were league runners-up again in 1934–35 before winning the league in 1935–36. Lye were runners-up in the Worcestershire Combination for a third time in 1937–38, also winning the Birmingham Junior Cup, retaining the Cup the following season.

Following World War II Lye played in the Central Amateur League in the 1946–47 season before joining the Birmingham & District League in 1947. Lye were placed in the South Division when the league was re-organised in 1954, with a tenth-place finish seeing us placed in Division One for the 1955–56 season. We subsequently finished bottom of the Division and were relegated to Division Two. The league reverted to a single division in 1960 and was renamed the West Midlands (Regional) League in 1962.

The league gained a second division in 1965, with Lye becoming members of the Premier Division. Despite finishing bottom of the Premier Division in 1965–66 and 1966–67, the club were not relegated to Division One. Lye were Premier Division runners-up in 1976–77 before finishing second in three consecutive seasons between 1978–79 and 1980–81. In 1997–98 the club were Premier Division champions, but were not promoted to the Midland Alliance due to ground grading regulations.

2010–11 Lye won the Birmingham Midweek Floodlit Cup, beating Nuneaton Griff 1–0 in the final. Lye were Premier Division runners-up in 2012–13 and won the Floodlit Cup for a second time with a 2–1 win over Southam United in the final. The club went on to win both the Worcestershire Senior Urn and the Premier Division the following season, earning promotion to the Premier Division of the newly formed Midland League. In the 2021–22 season Lye won the JW Hunt Cup.

In 2022-23 Lye finished second to Walsall Wood in the Midland League Premier Division. Having come runners up they were drawn away to Cambridgeshire side St Neots Town in a Step 4/5 Inter Play-Off game. Lye won 6-1 and gained promotion to Step 4 for the first time in their history.

GROUND

The club play at the Sports Ground on Stourbridge Road, which is shared with the local cricket club. a temporary rail is erected on the northern side of the pitch during the football season.



A seated stand was built at the Stourbridge Road end after World War II. A new stand was built on the southern side of the pitch in 1971, with the seats from the post-war stand later moved into the newer stand when the older stand was demolished. The club has a covered standing area with a barrel roof built behind one goal.

James joined the Tulips from League rivals Shepshed Dynamos. A goalscoring midfielder James started off the season at EFL League Two new boys Notts County. James was the only goal scorer for the Shepshed side in their recent 6-1 defeat at the Sir Halley Stewart.

Tyler Winters

Tyler is a Peterborough United Youth player and has recently joined Spalding on a Loan from the EFL Club. Tyler is a pacy striker who has scored 6 goals in 7 games for the PUFC U18 Team this season.

Ben Heath

Goalkeeper Ben signed for the Tulips from Corby Town. Last season Ben was part of the Championship winning AFC Stamford side, he has also had spells at Northampton Town and Daventry Town.

Miguel Ngwa

Miguel joins the Tulips permanently after having spent a short period of time on loan at the end of last season. A pacy forward was previously on the books of Barwell FC and Northampton Town.

Dominik Wysocki

Dominik joins from UCL side Melton Town. He was previously selected for final trials for a place in the English Colleges FA National Team. Dominik has also represented Harborough Town in the Northern Premier League.

Charlie Wise

Charlie joins from Evesham United where he had been club captain. A 6'6" central defender Charlie has also appeared for Banbury, Brackley and Corby Town.

SPALDING UTD FC 23/24 **NORTHERN PREMIER LEAGUE - DIVISION ONE**



Club History



For decades it has been documented that Spalding United was formed in 1921, but research into club history has revealed that in fact, its existence goes back much earlier.

A chance sighting of an early team photograph on social media prompted some investigation and evidence gained shows that the club was formed back in 1905 following the amalgamation of the Fulney Institute and Victorias clubs was confirmed at a meeting in a local hostelry when it was decided that the name should be Spalding United.

A committee was formed and the home ground as to be the Low Grounds, but references were also made of games being played on Pinchbeck Road (Black Swan Field) which is now known as The Sir Halley Stewart Playing Field.

In 1952 the Tulips recorded their ground record attendance when playing Peterborough United, then a Midland League side, in a qualifying round of the FA Cup. A crowd of 6,973 packed into the ground and saw Spalding leading 2-0 with ten minutes to play but Posh fought back to equalise and went on to win the replay 3-0. Further progress followed with success in the Lincolnshire Senior A Cup in 1953.

The club has reached the first-round proper of the FA Cup on two occasions. In 1957/58 they lost 3-1 to Durham City and in 1964/65 they played Football League opposition for the first time, being beaten 5-3 in a thrilling encounter at Newport County.

Spalding became United Counties League champions for the first time in 1955, having been runnersup in 1951, 1952 and 1953. They joined the Eastern Counties League but were without success and joined the Central Alliance League. They stayed just one season before transferring to the re-formed Midland League in 1961. In 1968 they rejoined the United Counties League and won the title for a second time in 1975.

In 1989/90 Spalding enjoyed an excellent run in the FA Vase, progressing to a home quarter-final tie with Guiseley, who included former Leicester City and England striker Frank Worthington in their side. A crowd of 2,020 saw Guiseley win 3-1 in extra time, having equalised in stoppage time. Things took a down turn with relegation back to the United Counties League the following season.

In 1998 they finished third in the league and again reached the quarter-final stage of the FA Vase, losing 2-1 at home to eventual winners Tiverton Town in front of 2,038 spectators. In 1998/99 the club won the United Counties League championship, the Lincolnshire A Cup and the Hinchingsbrooke Cup. As UCL champions Spalding regained membership of the Southern League and competed in the Eastern Division for season 1999/2000. They finished in a creditable 15th position. Year (2011/12) started on a high with a partnership deal with top local junior club Spalding Athletic JFC, putting us in contact with age group football from under-7 to under-18. Sadly the season ended in relegation but despite this set back they aimed at a return to step 4. In 2012/13 they narrowly missed winning promotion by one point but won the UCL Knockout Cup, beating promoted St Ives Town 4-0 in the final. The UCL championship trophy, however, was brought back to town in convincing style in 2013/14 season with the title secured with four matches of the season remaining. Looking to build on the success of winning promotion to Level 4, the "Boardroom" was strengthened by the appointment of a Chief Executive Officer in local businessman and former player, Malcolm Gray.

Club History

(Continued)

With the formation of a reserve side and a commitment to strengthen the club as part of the local community, the club look forward to the challenge of establishing itself at step 4.

A return to the Evo-Stik NPL for the 2014/15 season was highly successful with the team always placed in the leading group and eventually finished in a very respectful seventh position in Division One South. The season also saw the introduction of an under-18 team.

The 2016/17 campaign evolved as their best, finishing in their highest ever placing in the modern Football Pyramid. The Tulips finished in third position in NPL First Division South, just missing out on promotion from Level Four when losing by the odd goal in three away to second placed Witton Albion. The Tulips had, infact, never been outside the top three all season. In addition, the club had three players – Nathan Stainfield (for the third time), Michael Duggan and Bradley Wells named in the South division team of the year. Following an indifferent start to the 2018/19 season manager Chris Rawlinson and chairman Andy Gay mutually agreed to part company. Assistant manager Matt Easton was put in temporary charge of the team but formally took over the reins towards the end of September. The season, however, was largely disappointing with the team languishing in the lower regions almost throughout and ultimately just avoiding relegation.

The end of October, 2019 heralded a new era with new ownership of the club with an influx of new shareholders and directors in a complete restructure of the company and board. The new emphasis being putting the community of Spalding at the heart of everything the club envisaged. Existing shareholders Rod Quinton and Graham Chappell welcoming local businessman and solicitor Paul Turnell as a new shareholder. The three were joined by shareholder/director positions for Andrew Gay, Jennifer Gay, Eddie Reeve and Phil Brennan. Successful businessman Iain Crawford was also welcomed onto the 'board'. Andy Gay would continue as chairman with wife Jennifer as club treasurer. In early December manager Matt Easton rocked the club by unexpectedly resigning. His assistant Lewis Thorogood stepped up to fill the breach on a temporary basis and as the season was forced to a premature end due to the Covid 19 virus epidemic, he was handed the position on a permanent basis. However, following a good start to the 2020 season with two wins, three successive defeats led to him stepping down into a new role within the club.

A new era for the club began on August 19, 2020, when it was announced that pending FA and League approval, with AK Holdings agreeing the purchase of Spalding United Football Club. Andrew Killingsworth owner of AK Holdings would be the new and proud owner of SUFC with Leigh Porter installed as the new CEO. Former chairman Andrew Gay will remain at the club as vice-chairman.

For Season 2021/2022 high hopes were expected with ex-Peterborough Star Gabby Zakuani in charge however results were disappointing and Zakuani left the role in December to be replaced by ex-Wisbech Town man Brett Whaley. The Tulips maintained a mid table position despite some excellent results against high flying Halesowen Town, Belper Town, Ilkeston Town and Coleshill Town.

At the start of the 2022-2023 season the Tulips were unbeaten until January and were the last level 8 club to be unbeaten from the start of the season going in to the New Year, however a very poor run of form saw Whaley replaced by interim Senior Player Elliot Sandy. The club reached the final of the Lincolnshire Senior Trophy however they went down 1-0 to Grantham Town. A fine run of form, including a 2-1 away victory at newly crowned champions Stamford, saw the Tulips in to the Playoffs. A 2-1 semi final win over Sporting Khalsa saw them visit the home of Halesowen Town with over 3500 supporters attending. Heartbreak for the Tulips as an injury time goal from the hosts equalised an early Captain Stainfield header and an extra time winner saw the Yeltz promoted. Interim Manager Elliot Sandy was then offered the job on a full time basis and he is now building a squad to hopefully have another push for promotion to Step 3.

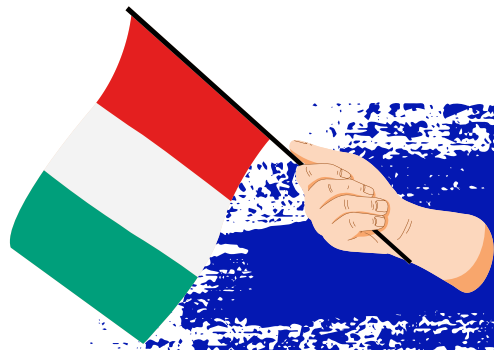

I wonder which football club my son will support, if any.

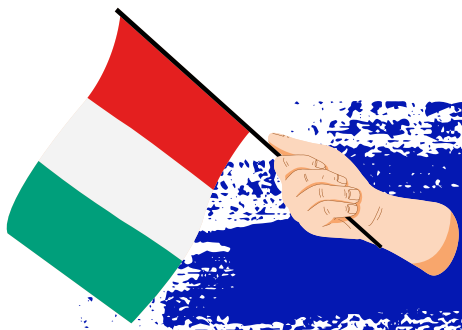
My wife's contractions started around ten minutes before Joe Palmer scored our late winner at Bedworth and Jake entered the world on Sunday morning.

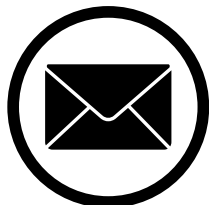

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

- SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with NO SYMPTOMS or family history.
- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.
- Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.
- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.
